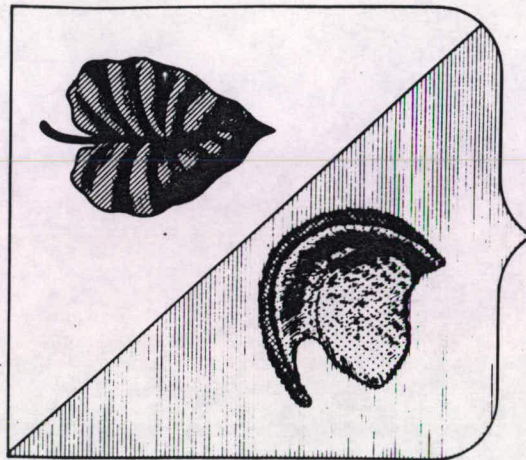

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Rescission of Coat of Arms and Distinctive Insignia
for the 100th Infantry Battalion, Separate

1. The coat of arms and distinctive insignia for the 100th Infantry Battalion, Separate, approved by letters SPQRD 424 and SPQRD 421 - 100th Infantry Bn, the Adjutant General's Office, 3 February 1943; and amended by letter SPQRD 424 - 100th Infantry Battalion (Sep), the Adjutant General's Office, 15 February 1943, are rescinded.
2. This rescission is in accordance with "Official Statement of Lineage and Battle Honors" for the 442nd Infantry Regiment which indicates the 100th Infantry Battalion, Separate, and the 442nd Infantry Regiment have been combined as the 442nd Infantry Regiment, therefore the coats of arms of these two organizations have been combined to form a new one, continuing the traditions of both.

1. By the authority delegated to The Quartermaster General by 2nd Indorsement, AG/421.7 Insignia (9-15-42) OB-I, The Adjutant General's Office, October 8, 1942, the coat of arms approved by letter SPQRD 424 - 100th Infantry Battalion, this office, February 3, 1943, is amended by cancelling the description contained therein and substituting the following:

The 100th Infantry Battalion (Separate) was constituted on the Regular Army inactive list, pursuant to letter, War Department, AG 320.2 (6-2-42), dated 4 June, 1942. The Battalion was made active at Oakland, California, 12 June, 1942. The 100th Infantry Battalion (Separate) has no other history and is not entitled to battle honors.

The blue is for the Infantry. The taro leaf and the Hawaiian warrior's helmet both represent Hawaii.

1. By the authority delegated to The Quartermaster General by 2nd Indorsement, AG 431.7 Insignia (9-15-42) 03-1, The Adjutant General's Office, October 8, 1942, the coat of arms described below is approved under the provisions of Paragraph 5, AGI 260-10, November 20, 1931 for the

SHIELD: Per bend argent and azure on the first a tere leaf proper, on the second a Hawaiian warrior's helmet of the last (gold feathers trimmed in maroon).

CREST: None.

MOTTO: Remember Pearl Harbor.

DESCRIPTION

The 100th Infantry Battalion (Separate) was constituted on the Regular Army inactive list, pursuant to letter, War Department, AG 320.2 (4-2-42), dated 4 June, 1942. The Battalion was made active at Oakland, California, 12 June, 1942. The 100th Infantry Battalion (Separate) has no other history and is not entitled to battle honors.

The blue is for the Infantry. The tere leaf and the Hawaiian warrior's helmet are both identified with Hawaii. With the exception of 1% every man in the organization was in service at the time of the December 7th attack, about 62% on the Island of Oahu and about 38% on the outlying islands. The motto is self-explanatory in commemoration of the Japanese attack and the popular slogan adopted afterward.
