

Pfc Kiyoto Mori

March 26, 1916 - December 5, 1943



Kiyoto Mori was born on March 26, 1916, in Hanapepe, Kauai. He was the son of Kiyoshi and Hazue (Kawaguchi) Mori. He was educated at Eleele School, Waimea High and Elementary School, Kauai. Before entering the service, he was employed as clerk at the Kauai Terminal, Ltd., Kauai.

Mori SN 30100501) was inducted in the Army at Lihue, Kauai on December 10, 1940.

He trained at Schofield Barracks, Oahu, Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, and Camp Shelby, Mississippi.

He served with the 299th Infantry Regiment and the 100th Infantry Battalion, Company D, in the Hawaiian Island, continental United States, Algeria, and Italy.

He was awarded the Purple Heart Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge, American Defense Service Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal, American and European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medals, and the World War II Victory Medal.

Pfc. Kiyoto Mori was killed in action at Scapoli, Italy, during the Salerno to Cassino Campaign on December 5, 1943.

He is interred at the Kauai County Cemetery, in Lihue, Kauai.
